This case study explains how we've used the mechanisms within the TPC 2005 to identify and implementsignificant performance improvement on a major modernisation programme.

The Partnering Team faced many challenges during the initial contract period – finding it wasn't 'working' for any party. We needed to understand and resolve a number of significant problems. We wanted to succeed but needed a clearer path to follow, one more closely aligned to the mechanisms within TPC 2005, to deal with the underlying issues.

Appointing a Partnering Advisor saw us building on the strengths and mutual objectives of the team -and starting to eliminate the weaknesses. We developed a clear framework for action using a facilitated partnering workshop and with ongoing independent support. An Action Plan has been instrumental in delivering significant turnaround – beyond expectation and with fresh vigour.

We now have a unified approach with shared objectives and a clearer understanding of how individual action can positively impact upon overall performance. We have learnt lessons which make this an exemplar case study. We're taking these lessons back into our individual organisations to delivering positive change elsewhere. This study and in particular, its legacy, makes this case study relevant during challenging market conditions and at a time when some partnerships are reverting to adversarial behaviours. At its heart, it champions the principles of the TPC2005. Amicus Horizon, Ian Williams, Hedley Visick and PML make up our 'Team' demonstrating the partnerships clear commitment to 'early contractor involvement' and 'partnering down the supply chain'.
